



REPORT CDCI NEW PRESIDENT

International Consultative Diplomatic Committee (ICDC)

Nominated to the Presidency from the 1st of December is Mr Abraham Gozes, Lord of the Manor of Eastleigh. Resident of Monaco for 40 years, husband of a citizen of Monaco with whom he has 2 children. Member of Mensa, the international organization which consists of people of the highest IQ's (Intelligence Quotient), art consultant in Monaco from 1980 to 1999, at the same time head of a British press agency in Paris, President in 2002 of the Lord Eastleigh Foundation for the Development of Art and Culture based in the US, first curator of Mamac (the Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art), head of The Cultural Mission, member of the information service to the Diplomatic and Consular Code in Switzerland, President of the prestigious "Royal Rolls Royce Club of Monaco", accredited with several noble titles including Lord of the Manor of Eastleigh which he uses the most frequently. His motto is "By My Faith".

Lord Eastleigh has already risen to fame in the past in politically sensitive issues, dealing with justice, scandals regarding breaches in democracy and respect for human and family rights. He does not hesitate to question state authorities and intervenes, something for which he is accredited by the European Commission. Thanks to his legendary tenacity and the accuracy of his analysis, he has obtained changes in outdated laws, which are no longer suitable for today's world.

Very charismatic, incorruptible and deeply democratic, he will be at ease at the head of the ICDC, where his role will be first and foremost that of examiner consists of analysing, verifying, investigating the workings of, the regulations, the influence of pressure groups on European laws and possible abuses and the facts behind corruption. For ethical reasons or contractual commitments of confidentiality, some of these studies will be published without signatures. Others will be published with a signature from their authors who have expressed the desire to see their name and their quality come to guarantee the reliability of their work.

The ICDC will award a prize of honor to people whose actions have led to real human progress in the several fields concerned. Our society is unfortunately more and more often involved in scandals, corruption, various forms of embezzlement linked to the aim of profiting, at the expense of a population often kept ignorant of reality. If the ICDC chooses to establish itself as a safeguard in the light of the conclusions from these studies, their experts will suggest some actions or will make proposals to rectify these dysfunctions and bring about improvements.
